Welcome to our 1000 Books Before Kindergarten Program!

Did you know that reading to your child is one of the most powerful ways to boost their brain power? The simple and enjoyable act of sharing books helps your child learn pre-reading skills such as understanding the sounds that words and letters make, developing a larger vocabulary, and building background knowledge—all important skills that help prepare your child for learning to read and entering kindergarten.

The E.D. Locke's Public Library's 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program is a fun, exciting, and free way to start your child on the path to success! Any child ages birth to five years can participate.

- 1. Register online at mcfarlandlibrary.beanstack.org or through the Beanstack app.
- 2. Track Your Reading in this booklet and on Beanstack
- 3. Every Book Counts: Even if your child wants to hear the same book again and again, you can count it each time. You can also count the books your child hears in storytime, in daycare or preschool, or with a friend or family member, as long as your child listens to the entire book.
- 4. 1,000 Books: You did it! Come celebrate at the library. Your child will receive a free book and certificate of completion. .
- 5. Keep on Reading: Don't stop at 1,000! Keep on reading together; there's more learning ahead!

Singing songs, saying rhymes, telling stories, and playing with your child are all great ways to build their literacy skills. Visit the E.D. Locke Public Library often for free programs that are fun and educational for your little one and to find great books to share with your child.

How to access



You can download the mobile app, visit the library's beanstack page mcfarlandlibrary.beanstack.org, or scan the QR Code.



- The app/site will guide you straight to your free account. If you have used Beanstack in the past for other library reading programs you can just log in to your account and add/enroll children in to the program.
- Under Discover/Challenges you will find the 1000 Books reading challenge. Tap to register.
- Start logging your reading.
- If you are using the app, you can scan the barcode of any book for instant logging, no need for typing.


